The 3rd International Professional Programme of the Thessaloniki Book Fair, which takes place at the DIALOGUE Rights Centre (Pavilion 15, HELEXPO Exhibition Centre), has become an institution that attracts prestigious publishers and literary agents from abroad, providing an opportunity for greater extroversion of Greek production, combined with the relaunch of the *GreekLit* translation programme. Now in its third year, the professional programme has attracted 30 participants from prominent publishing houses and 19 major countries, including Canada, USA, France, Italy, Germany, Spain, the UK, the Netherlands, India, Poland, Lithuania, Estonia, Serbia, Argentina, Egypt, Turkey, Romania, Bangladesh and Armenia, among others.
